

Sunday, February 17, 2019 - "The Rock Is Not Rocked" - Norflette Shumake

Key Passages: Psalm 62:1-12, Ephesians 6:13-14, Ephesians 1:20-22, 2:6

- Feel free to read the passage(s) out loud as a group
- Allow the group to share freely about what stood out to them from the passage or from Sunday's message

## Main Ideas

- In the early church (Acts) God was doing extraordinary things but the church also face opposition
- With every movement of God there is a counter-movement
  - Sometimes we get distracted by the opposition
  - BUT..."The Rock is Not Rocked"
- Psalm 62
  - I shall not be greatly shaken (David expected some sway and some opposition)
  - David understood opposition
    - he had been outmatched, outnumbered, betrayed, abandoned and had people trying to kill him
    - But he knew that his deliverance came from God alone (the source of his strength/salvation)
- "Stand on the Rock and you will not be shaken"
- We belong to God and are seated with Christ in the heavenly places
  - The enemy is trying to bring us down to low places
  - We can move forward in fear or in the steadfast love that the Lord has for us
- Ephesians 6:13-14
  - We are called to stand firm
  - To discover the truth (not just the facts)
  - The truth is that God is Good and he is working it out for our good
  - God is fighting for us and God is on our side
- Ephesians 1:20-22, 2:6
  - If we're seated with Him in heavenly places then we are above all authority, power and dominion too
  - We need to learn to keep our eyes on Jesus (Psalm 16:8)
  - Who do we see? What do we say?
  - Sometimes we just need to open our mouths (Matthew 16: Peter saying who Jesus was)
- SWAY = to move back and forth S = Seeing W = What's A = Available in Y = You
- SWAG = to strut, parade, stride, walk with confidence S = Seeing W = What's A = Available in G = Gpd
- God is not rocked BUT he is moved
  - To compassion for us
  - The cross (he cares for and loves us)
  - He WILL fight for us

- 1. When was a a time that you were distracted by the opposition? What was it keeping you from? What did you learn?
- 2. What does it mean to you personally to be seated with Christ in heavenly places?
- 3. What is God calling you to say about him or to him in the midst of trial and hardship?
- 4. How is God directing you to keep your eyes on Him? What does that look like in your life?
- 5. What would your life look like if you walked more confidently in God and how much he cares for you and fights for you?
- 6. What are some counter-movements in your life as God is doing things in you and through you?
- 7. What is God inviting you into as a result of this passage or sermon?
