Key Passages: Ruth 2, Leviticus 19:9-10

- Feel free to read the passage(s) out loud as a group
- Allow the group to share freely about what stood out to them from the passage or from Sunday's message

Main Ideas

- Ruth is a historical narrative that doesn't have any commands, but there is a lot to learn
- We are trying to answer the questions: Who is this woman, and how did she come to have a book of the Bible?
- Historical Context: The time of the Judges
  - People we're doing what was right in their own eyes
  - Much like today (relativism)
  - It creates an opportunity for us to shine like stars (Philippians)
- Hesed: radical, extraordinary, uncommon, unpredictable, reckless love
  - This causes us to shine like stars in the world
  - This is what Ruth and Boaz are such an example of in the book of Ruth
- Ruth 2 is all about this radical love and generosity
  - Boaz was a "worthy" man = prominent, influential, wealthy, mighty, good standing, noble character
  - Ruth goes to glean in the fields
    - A common practice in that society
    - On a good day someone could glean a handful of grain (enough for a meal or maybe meals for a day)
    - It was hard work, and only a means of survival
    - Ruth offering to glean is a great sacrifice
    - She "happened to" end up in the field of Boaz...but it's not just luck
    - Even when we don't see God working, he is up to something
  - · Boaz extends help and generosity to Ruth
    - He recognized Ruth's sacrifice
      - She laid down her whole life for Naomi, her mother-in-law
      - Boaz saw Ruth's Hesed
    - Boaz does something uncommon and out of the norm
      - Leviticus 19:9-10
      - Anytime God calls us to give is an invitation for us to learn to trust Him
      - It must have been very hard for Boaz to do what he did (coming off of a famine, giving Ruth
      - extra grain and giving her the opportunity to work
- Generosity is more than just tithing
  - Being willing to give when it seems irresponsible or reckless (Hesed lifestyle -> shine like stars)
  - Boaz's generosity equipped and empowered Ruth and gave Naomi and Ruth hope and a future
  - Boaz's generosity and Hesed is a picture of Jesus (Boaz "came from Bethlehem)
  - God's hesed for us is proved and confirmed through Jesus

- 1. How has God been challenging you to live a Hesed lifestyle? What are some steps he has put before you?
- 2. When is a time you experienced the radical love and generosity of someone else?
- 3. Has God ever given you an opportunity to "shine like stars"? What was going on and what was it like?
- 4. How have you responded when God gave you an invitation to trust Him? Was it good or bad? Easy or difficult? What did you learn about yourself or about God?
- 5. What comes to mind when you think about generosity being more than just tithing?
- 6. What is God inviting you into as a result of this passage or message?
