Key Passages: 1 Peter 1:1-7, 1 Peter 1:14-16, 1 Peter 2:9-10, 1 Peter 3:15

- Feel free to read the passage(s) out loud as a group
- Allow the group to share freely about what stood out to them from the passage or from Sunday's message

Main Ideas

- When we think of saints we often think of "special" human beings who did all these great things
- Anyone who is redeemed by the blood of the Lamb is a saint (what we do on a daily basis is important)
- We don't want to switch up FAME and FAITHFULNESS (faithfulness gets God's attention)
- 1 Peter: Peter is writing from Rome to those dispersed throughout the Roman empire
- He's writing to the chosen (redeemed by Jesus) and exiled (the church is being persecuted)
- The church needed encouragement and we need encouragement now
- Peter's 4 Encouragement's
 - 1) Don't forget to celebrate salvation (1 Peter 1:3-5)
 - Though there is pain/turmoil we have an inheritance that is imperishable (and we praise God for this)
 - We have to be aware: we are being marginalized but also lulled to sleep by being comfortable at times
 - How do we live out our faith when we are marginalized but also comfortable
 - 2) Live with eternal perspective (1 Peter 1:6-7)
 - Trials are for a little while only
 - What is after is so much better
 - 3) Embrace Holiness (1 Peter 1:14-16)
 - Beyond the outward appearance and not about being perfect
 - When we encounter God's presence the Holy Spirit convicts us and we want to respond out of love
 - It's not about condemnation BUT conviction
 - "The root determines the fruit"...Holiness is a byproduct of time spent in God's presence
 - 1 Peter 2:9-10: Set apart as a Holy nation and a royal priesthood
 - Holiness is pursuing God
 - 4) Engage the world (John 17:14-19)
 - Set apart BUT NOT disengaged from the world
 - Too much leading with our mouths and not enough with our lives
 - God wants light to shine in the midst of darkness
- 1 Peter 3:15
 - Believes were accused of incest (calling one another brother/sister) and cannibalism (communion)
 - They had to be ready to explain why they did what they did and lived how they lived
 - We need to be prepared to give an answer...at all time
