Key Passages: Acts 9:10-19, Acts 8:1

- Feel free to read the passage(s) out loud as a group
- Allow the group to share freely about what stood out to them from the passage or from Sunday's message

Main Ideas

- Unsung Hero = one who does good deeds but receives little or no recognition for it
- This week's unsung hero: Ananias the disciple
- Acts 9
  - The book of Acts is about action
  - A community living out the great commandment and the great commission
  - God is up to something...have we surrendered to God's movement
- Every move of God will meet some opposition
  - But we don't face it alone (God is with us, for us, and in us)
  - The believers in Acts knew hoe to rejoice in opposition
- It was dangerous for Ananias to be a follower of Jesus (Acts 8:1)
  - Stephen was executed (died for doing good)
  - The church was scattered and persecuted
- Saul threatened and murdered...people like Ananias
  - Could the people we hate have the answers that we need
  - Could someone we don't like be who God has called us to?
- Ananias was a "Hear & Obey" Disciple
  - He was AVAILABLE
    - "Lord HERE I AM"
    - God is not asking for your resume he is looking to use people who are available (Isaiah, Abraham, Mary)
    - Do you trust God enough to yield to Him?
    - We can trust Him because he knows us (He called Ananias by name)
    - · God knew Paul and that he needed God's grace...and the grace of believers
  - He was COURAGEOUS
    - Ananias knew who Saul was
    - Courage to go...FAITH TO RISK
  - He was **TEACHABLE** 
    - · He was willing to change his view about Saul
    - We need to relate to people on who they are and could be, rather than what they have done
  - He was SPIRIT-INFLUENCED
    - Lord lead me, Lord fill me
    - Ananias called Saul his brother
    - We have received Grace so we have...Grace to give
- We are on mission for God and we have to be ACTS = Available, Courageous, Teachable, and Spirit-Influenced)

Questions (Feel free to use all of these, some of these, or none of these)

- 1. How is God challenging you to trust him so that you can yield to Him?
- 2. Where is God asking you to be available? Who is he asking you to be available to?
- 3. What are you willing to risk for God and his mission? What are you not willing to risk?
- 4. Give an example of a time when you said "Lord, here I am" and saw Him move
- 5. How is God calling you to surrender to his movement?
- 6. What is God inviting you into as a result of this passage or sermon?
