Key Passages: Isajah 58:1-14, Zecharjah 7:4-10, Isajah 61:8, Amos 5:24, Malachi 6:8, Proverbs 31:8

- Allow the group to share freely about what stood out to them from the passage or from Sunday's message

Main Ideas

- Who God is....how that affects what God expects of us
- "What comes into our minds when we think about God is the most important thing about us" Tozer
- Isaiah 58:1-14 (Really a case study on human behavior)
- It feels like the people are getting some thing right (v1-4)
 - But something is off
 - There is a block between them and God
 - They were doing a lot and missed the heart of God...this can be true of us as well
 - God is inviting us into a life changing give and take relationship WITH Him and not FOR Him
- All throughout scripture and history God has great compassion and love for the MOST VULNERABLE
- Essentially God said to his people and is saying to us "If you loved me, you would love what I love."
- God desires for us to move towards those who are in need
 - Zechariah 7:4-10 (they were in captivity and doing religion to get God help them)
 - We can do this too...doing things for God so that he will do things for us
 - When we oppress or neglect those in need or only act for our betterment we insult God (Proverbs 14:31)
- · God identifies with the poor and oppressed
 - Isaiah 61:8, Amos 5:24
 - "I the Lord love justice"
- What is justice? (sometimes it's easier to know what is an injustice)
 - Malachi 6:8
 - to do justice is to do whatever we are able to do to end injustice
 - 3 ways
 - 1) Equal treatment (Leviticus 24:22)
 - 2) Advocacy (Proverbs 31:8 We use what we have for the benefit of others)
 - 3) Generosity (Isaiah 58:10 pour yourself out...spend yourself)
- "Our motivation is not duty but beauty" Tim Keller
- Because of God's great love and compassion for us we look towards the good and benefit of others
- The movement of God starts with an invitation...TO DO JUSTICE

- 7. What is God inviting you into as a result of this passage or sermon?
