Key Passages: Luke 16:1-15, 1 Timothy 6:17

- Feel free to read the passage(s) out loud as a group
- Allow the group to share freely about what stood out to them from the passage or from Sunday's message

Main Ideas

- Whole life generosity is an invitation from God. It's not about what God wants from you but what God has for you
- Luke 16:1-15
  - Jesus is not saying the manage is honest...just shrewd
  - We're called to be shrewd but also to be honest
- v9: Make friends for yourselves by means of unrighteous wealth
  - It gets lost in translation
  - · Unrighteous wealth had a particular connotation and context
- Unrighteous Wealth ("mammon of unrighteousness)
  - It was a pejorative phrase that meant you can't trust in riches
  - Cultural context -> Wealth is unpredictable, money is a liar (1 Timothy 6:17)
  - This is in contrast to "true riches"
- ...make friends for yourselves (doesn't mean use your money to make friends)
  - Jesus doesn't say if riches fail, he says when they fail (v9b)
    - Eternal dwellings
      - We will know each other in heaven
      - We will know the good and the bad we did on earth
  - God is saying, "Use what I have entrusted to you to advance the Kingdom. People will see and know even in eternity"
- "What you do with what you have now is what you will do with it when you have more" Doug Kempton
- Jesus is saying, "Use this fickle thing called wealth to advance the Kingdom of God"
- Generosity...ARE YOU IN?
  - It won't happen by accident
    - Where are you at and where does God want you to be?

- 6. How is God calling you to be intentional and accountable when it comes to generosity?
- 7. What is God inviting you into as a result of this passage or sermon?
