

Sunday, February 23, 2020 - "You Asked For It - Week 8 - Why Is The Bible So Down On Women?" - Doug Kempton

Key Passages: Genesis 2:18, Psalm 121:1-2, Psalm 124:8, 1 Timothy 2:12, Ephesians 5:21-25

- Feel free to read the passage(s) out loud as a group
- · Allow the group to share freely about what stood out to them from the passage or from Sunday's message

Main Ideas

- Is it a sin to drink alcohol?
 - Ephesians 5:18. 1 Timothy 5:23 (Timothy told to drink a little, but we are instructed not to drink in excess)
 - What is the wise thing for you to do? (this is different for different people)
- Why is the Bible so down on women? -> there is a myth/false dichotomy that exists
- False Narrative starts in Genesis (men and women are both created to be the image of God)
 - Genesis 2:18 ("I will make him a helper")
 - Helper is the word EZER which means support in times of hardship or distress
 - This word is used most to describe God (Psalm 121:1-2, Psalm 124:8)
 - Women are not "little helpers" but rather integral to all of us and to the church
- We are only complete as a body of believers when male and female are living out there giftings...BUT this doesn't mean you need to be married to be complete
- 1 Timothy 2:12 (perpetuating the false narrative)
 - On the surface this verse is very demeaning to women
 - But the word authority in this passage would of meant "to originate with ones own hand"
 - There was a culture in this place/time that worshipped Artemis and emphasized the feminine and devalued the masculine...Paul was setting straight a spiritual stronghold (women believed that men should be subservient to them because by giving birth women gave origin to men and should have authority)
- The bible is not down on women
 - · The Story of Jesus
 - The first evangelist was the woman at the well in John 4:28-30
 - The first person to proclaim the risen Jesus (the Gospel) was Mary and she told the disciples
 - · Jesus gave women a voice
 - Acts 18:24-26 (Priscilla lead the way in **teaching** a man the way of God more correctly)
- Male and Female are equal but different (there is a difference and a value to feminine and masculine characteristics)
- Ephesians 5:21-25 SUBMIT TO ONE ANOTHER
 - The heading "wives and husbands" is not actually in the text
 - v22 and 25 are the how to live out v21
 - Men submitted to their wives and women submitted to their husbands
 - v23 What are the implications of headship
 - In the world authority comes from power and control
 - But in the way of Jesus, those called to lead are called to serve (Luke 22:25-27)
 - Husbands are called to "go and serve your wives. out-serve your wives"
 - Not to take the lead in making decisions
- Male elders at Grace are called to be defenders and protectors BUT decisions about the church are made with women involved in the process
- Ephesians 4:29 Building others up...men and women
