Key Passages: Genesis 37:1-11

- · Allow the group to share freely about what stood out to them from the passage or from Sunday's message

## Main Ideas

- In ancient times it was believed that if you were poor/sick/going through hardship -> You were out of step with God
  - We can believe this at times as well (sometimes our sin has consequences) but it's not always true
  - · God was with Joseph and God is with you
- Family Matters
  - · Family of origin affects us in both positive and negative ways
  - We have to be intentional about dealing with family wounds and challenges
- Jacob (Joseph's father) loved him more then the rest of his brothers (this mad them jealous)
  - We have to be careful about not showing favoritism (creates dysfunction)
  - Jospeh got a robe from his dad. It was ornate and beautiful, a robe worn by royalty
  - This was not just a gift but a symbol that Joseph was "special" and in charge
  - His brothers were angry to the point that they couldn't even extend him the greeting of "shalom"
- Joseph then recounts his dreams of his brothers and family bowing to him
  - · This family knows that dreams mean something
  - It made his brothers angry but his father kept it in mind
- · How is this family so dysfunctional
  - Abraham (Joseph's great grandfather) lied about his wife to the king
  - Isaac (Joseph's grandfather) ALSO lied about his wife to the king
  - Isaac loved one son more than the other which led to Jacob manipulating his father
- Un-dealt with family sin patterns will get worse from generation to generation Doug Kempton
- Dealing with family matters
  - Be honest and open (see things honestly...relationships, situations, wounds)
  - Embrace the good and shatter the bad
  - Bring it all into the light
- God uses broken people
  - Surrender to Him
  - · Enter into a relationship of healing and growth

- 5. Is there a specific step God is asking you to take? Being honest and open? Embracing good and shattering bad?
- 6. What is God inviting you into as a result of this passage or sermon?
