Key Passages: Leviticus 20:7, Proverbs 13:12, Matthew 25:1-13, Matthew 24:36. Matthew 24:44, Isaiah 40:31

- Feel free to read the passage(s) out loud as a group
- Allow the group to share freely about what stood out to them from the passage or from Sunday's message

Main Ideas

- Advent is a season of sanctification, consecration, preparation
 - Consecration = to make or declare sacred, to set apart or dedicate to the worship of God
 - Preparing ourselves for the coming of Christ...it takes daily intentionality
- This week..HOPE (Proverbs 13:12)
 - Hoping for something longer than expected --> heartache
 - . The more we want it and the longer we wait the more heartache we feel
- Matthew 25:1-13 part of Olivet discourse (4 parables) that teach us how to live between the 1st and 2nd coming of Christ
- Cultural context
 - 10 virgins are the bridesmaids
 - They would light the way and build excitement as the groom went to get his bride to bring to the banquet
 - The story is not about marriage but about preparing for the 2nd coming of Jesus
 - Matthew 25:1a "Then the kingdom of heaven will be like..."
 - We live in this time, the now but not yet
 - WATCH THEREFORE
 - We are called to follow this command in Advent
 - What does it mean to watch?
 - Be prepared
 - We are called to live as if Jesus could return today or like he could come in the next generation

- All of the oil we need no matter how long it takes
 - Holy Spirit
 - The presence of God
- Advent is a time to fill the lamp of our soul, to watch and prepare
- · Movement of God always starts with an invitation
 - Psalm 139 prayer of David...search me, know me, any grievous way in me?
 - Turn away from anything that is competing with God in your heart and life
- Practical ways to practice Advent
 - Advent guide (download or pick up at front entrance of church)
 - Women's Advent event (Friday Dec 4th online)
 - Chapel weekdays (7-8am online)
 - Read Olivet discourse Matthe 24 & 25
 - Talk about Advent (family, c- group, etc.)
- Matthew 24:44, Isaiah 40:31

- 2. What does it look like for you to "watch therefore" during this season of Advent?
- 3. How is God asking you to "fill the lamp" of your soul this Advent?

- 5. What is God inviting you into as a result of this passage or sermon?
