Key Passages: Mark 14:12-26, Exodus 6:6-8

- · Feel free to read the passage(s) out loud as a group
- · Allow the group to share freely about what stood out to them from the passage or from Sunday's message

## Main Ideas

- Familiarity breeds complacency Doug Kempton
- · Imagine hearing the story of the Gospel for the first time
  - Jesus chose to willingly go to the cross
  - · As it becomes familiar we miss the wonder
  - We have to slow down and engage our imaginations
- Mark 14:12-26 What was really going on in the upper room
- · At Grace we believe the Gospels are factual and historically accurate
- The meal in the upper room was what is now know as a seder meal
  - · It was a ordered and organized meal
  - It would help the storyteller tell the story of the passover
  - Exodus story: the movement of God in and for the people of Israel
- · The meal required preparation and planning
  - They would set up a meal/table for unknown guests
  - The disciples had to gather the necessary elements for the ordered meal
- Each event or chapter in the story had a corresponding cup (4 cups)
- Exodus 6:6-8
  - · The I will statements of God
  - The four cups: slavery, plagues, sacrifice, praise
- The story of Israel is our story: A pre-cursor to Jesus and him setting us free
- · 1st Cup: Slavery
  - Affliction of ancestors in the past
  - $\bullet$  Is there something you are currently in bondage to? Do you need to experience freedom?
- 2nd Cup: Plagues
  - They didn't drink from this cup
  - They would recite the plagues
- 3rd Cup: Sacrifice (Elijah's/messiah's cup)
  - · Not only would they look back but they would dream about the coming Messiah
  - For 1,400 years they would look back and also forward
  - It wasn't random...Jesus knew the story and the cup of sacrifice
  - Jesus was saying "I am the passover lamb"...saying his blood was what would save people from the bondage of sin
- Every time we come to the communion table we are joining with a 3000 year old tradition and remembering the story of God's redemption
- Passover was a festival and a celebration in unity
  - We should come anticipating God's people in unity and community
  - Celebrating together Jesus' blood shed for us
- 4th Cup: Praise (they sang a hymn after taking communion)

Questions (Feel free to use all of these, some of these, or none of these)

- 1. What can you do this Holy Week to engage in the wonder of the Gospel?
- 2. How have you struggled in being complacent in your walk with God? What has he taught you about staying engaged?
- 3. What does communion mean to you? How have you experienced God's presence through this tradition?
- 4. If you are comfortable sharing, are there any areas of your life that you are in bondage? Where do you need to experience freedom?
- 5. How is God calling you to deepen your experience of communion?
- 6. What is God inviting you into as a result of this passage or sermon?
