Main Ideas

- We are entrenched in culture wars
 - We "power up"
 - The kingdom of God is upside down
- · Power was the name of the game in Jesus' day and we are still infatuated with power today
- We sometimes live in echo chambers = everyone we hear and see thinks the way we do -> we demonize those who don't think like us ->
- we power up
- · How do we find common ground?
 - "If we're to be one, I have to know your story and you have to know my story" Norflette Shumake
 - · We have to find a shared history
- We POWER UP because we are unsure of our identity
 - · We use our influence, education, wealth, network etc.
 - What empowers you or what makes you feel big?
 - · For someone to dominate someone else has to get small
- We have to POWER DOWN
- Power down to...throw it back to Jesus
 - Philippians 2:5-7
 - · When we doubt our value we figure out how to power up
 - · Jesus came down from his high place and instead he took the form of a servant (powered down)
- Power down to...work it out (Philippians 2:12)
 - Work out our salvation -> outworking of an in working of Jesus
 - Fear and trembling -> don't want to do anything that will mess up relationship with someone else
 - We prove our humility
- Power down to...let God work
 - v13: For HIS pleasure
 - · Can we trust God with our desires?
- Power down to...light up
 - v15: We shine as lights
 - we should be different
 - · We don't look like the world we live in
 - We are the light of the world
 - Deuteronomy 32:5
- We have to have difficult conversations
 - Not converse to harm or injure
 - Willing to share pain without weaponizing our hurt, willing to hear pain without weaponizing defense or response
- · When we live from false identity, we power up
- · When we power down and humble ourselves, there is GRACE
 - · More grace for the humble
 - · Not trying to assert our own favor but empowered by God
