

Sunday, January 23, 2022 - "Ancient Prophets - Week 2 - Hosea: An Epic Love Story" - Doug Kempton

Key Passages: Hosea 1:2, 2 Kings 14-17, Hosea 1:10-11, Hosea 4:6, Hosea 6:4, Hosea 13:6, Hosea 14:9

- · Allow the group to share freely about what stood out to them from the passage or from Sunday's message

Main Ideas

- · 2 Kings 14-17 for historical context of Hosea
 - Hosea speaking to the northern Kingdom = Israel/Ephraim/Jacob
 - · Nations split -> sin matters
 - · Solomon's sin (taking multiple wives)
 - False religion —> Part of the way of life for the people —> Synchronism (blending faith systems)
 - "Sin never reaps a profit and it always has a cost" Doug Kempton
- Hosea = an epic love story...not an allegory but historical fact
 - · Hosea and his wife Gomer
 - · God and his people
- · Hosea 1:2
 - · The people of Israel were an adulterous people
 - · Originally there was a mutual affection between Hosea and Gomer
 - Prophetic children's names: Jezreel (Israel would lose to Assyria), No Mercy (God won't show mercy), Not My People (they turned away from God)
- · The recurring theme of judgement and then mercy/hope/compassion
- Hosea 1:10-11
 - Messianic prophecy (salvation is coming through Jesus)
 - We are recipients of this prophecy
- · Ch 2: God and his people (They forgot God and didn't trust that he would provide)
- · Ch 3: Gomer leaves Hosea, but Hosea redeems her from slavery (foreshadowing of Jesus paying ransom for our sin)
- · Hosea represents God in this story and Gomer represents us
 - · We've gone our own way
 - · We are all Comers
- · God calls us into relationship with Him
 - · To actually know him
 - · Yada = Not just knowing about, but knowing and experiencing God in an intimate way
- · Hosea 4:6-7 Our prosperity causes us to arrogant and we forget all we have is a gift from God
- Hosea 6:4, Hosea 13:6
 - · We are prone to forget
 - · It is God who gives us breath
 - · Without Jesus we have nothing
- Israel betrays the one who loves them most...we have to ask How am I just like them?
- · Too often God is blamed for pain and suffering in the world
 - · Sin and Satan
 - Turning from God has a cost
 - The cry of the prophets over and over is.. RETURN TO GOD WITH YOUR WHOLE HEART
- Hosea 14:6

- 3. When was a time that you went your own way and how did God draw you back to Him and His ways?

- 5. How are you or how have you been just like the people of Israel?
- 6. How is God calling you to return to Him?
- 7. What is God inviting you into as a result of this passage or sermon?
