Key Passages: Revelation 17,

- Feel free to read the passage(s) out loud as a group
- · Allow the group to share freely about what stood out to them from the passage or from Sunday's message

Main Ideas

- · Where are you being challenged or convicted by God's word?
- The key for Revelation 17
 - Prostitute = the city of Rome (Babylon) -> represents cities of power/wealth/sin
 - Beast = Roman empire -> any power that rises up and oppresses people of God
 - 7 Heads = All (not just 7) of the emperors of Rome
 - Horns = Kings of Roman provinces
 - · Sexual immorality: Not necessarily just sexual immorality...allegiance from God to something else
 - Purple and Scarlet = symbols of royalty and wealth
 - 7 heads/7 hills: the land where Rome is situated
 - Babylon = every city of world power (includes the city of Babylon) —> represents the dead end street of humanity's attempt to build their culture apart from God
- Throughout history God makes a promise to a person or people and says wait for the season to come
 - They take matters into their own hands
 - Abraham...having a son
 - Moses...freedom and justice for his people
 - Joseph...dreams about leading his family
 - · As soon as a promise is made, Satan tries to steal it
 - · Temptation of Jesus..."You don't have to wait"
- It is easier to know what God promises than when it will happen
 - Applies to grand/corporate promises (believers reign and rule with Jesus)
 - Also to individual promises (He loves us like nothing we can imagine)
- The word wait in Hebrew is both wait AND trust
- Revelation is call to endurance
- "Babylon" is out there...but also inside of us...It's anything competing for our allegiance and devotion
