Key Passages: Genesis 22:1-19, Psalm 11:5, Proverbs 17:3, Jeremiah 17:10, James 1:2-4, Ephesians 4:15

- · Allow the group to share freely about what stood out to them from the passage or from Sunday's message

Main Ideas

- · Sacrifice of Isaac
 - · It's an outrageous request
 - But this was a common practice in the days of Abraham
- · After these things...
 - · Isaac was likely 20-30 years old
 - · Long journey of faithfulness with God
- · God TESTED Abraham
 - · Unthinkable...only son and promised heir
 - · We almost can't comprehend the request
 - · He didn't know but thought God could raise the dead
- · First time in scripture we see a person loving another person in the scriptures
- · Does God test all of his followers?
 - Yes he does...Psalm 11:5, Proverbs 17:3, Jeremiah 17:10
 - It wasn't a test to see what Abraham knew...God wasn't confused
 - · NOT God's evaluation of Abraham
 - The purpose of the test is to inform the test taker Doug Kempton (Jeremiah 17:9-10 we are easily deceived)
- · Our response to the test always informs us of what we truly believe
- · This isn't Abraham's first test
 - · Do you believe I am your provider? (leaving father's house, famine, Egypt)
 - · Do you believe I will protect you?
- · Sometimes test are circumstances, other times they are just obedience tests
- · 2 Important truths
 - 1) Tests and your response are not intended to produce shame/guilt
 - · They are invitations...being tested shows you are chosen
 - · God wants you to reach full potential
 - · 2) Horrific events in life aren't orchestrated by God to test you or someone else
 - · We live in a fallen world
 - · Because of sin we will have trouble/trial
- · God is still up to something good
- · Abraham got answers right later in life because he got them wrong earlier in life
- Test are to be expected and celebrated (James 1:2-4, Ephesians 4:15)
- · Abraham says "Here I am"... in contrast to Adam in the garden (open to God, full attention)
- · Listening takes being intentional
