Key Passages: Genesis 26:1-35, Philippians 1:6, Luke 10:27

## Main Ideas

- Genesis 26:1-5 (actually happens before chapter 25)
- Trio of dads -> birth of a nation/people
  - · Jesus was born into a people
  - · Into a specific nation with a unique history
- God makes Isaac 5 promises: I will be with you, I will bless you, I will give all these lands to you and your offspring, I will establish the oath I swore to you father, I will multiply your offspring
- Abraham's faithfulness: Abraham obeyed My voice, he kept My charge, he kept My commandments, he kept My statutes, he kept My laws
- · Genesis 15:6
  - God sees Abraham as obedient
  - When we believe -> credited to us as righteousness
- Isaac is PROTECTED (Genesis 26:10-11)
  - · God's faithfulness and sovereignty
  - · Isaac didn't need to fear for his life
- Isaac PROSPERS
  - · Economic prosperity isn't ALWAYS a sign of divine blessing
  - · Faithful christians are not all prosperous...God intentionally blesses Isaac but there is tension
- · Genesis 26:23-25 God reaffirms his promise
- Isaac experiences PEACE
  - · Isaac had to leave because of his wealth and prosperity
  - · But God brings peace between Isaac and the Philistines
- · God's promises to us aren't the same as to Isaac ... they're even better
  - · Presence of the Holy Spirit
  - Never leave us...through trouble...he has overcome the world
- Not just information but Spiritual transformation
  - · No doctrine layering onto our brains but interacting with and impacting our stories
  - · We don't have to be afraid...God is faithful
- 3 tenses of salvation -> Sanctification (Philippians 1:6)
  - · I have BEEN saved
  - I am BEING saved
  - I WILL BE saved
- · His faithfulness is the basis for our love for Him (Luke 10:27
