31 If anyone asks you, ‘Why are you untying it?’ you shall say this:

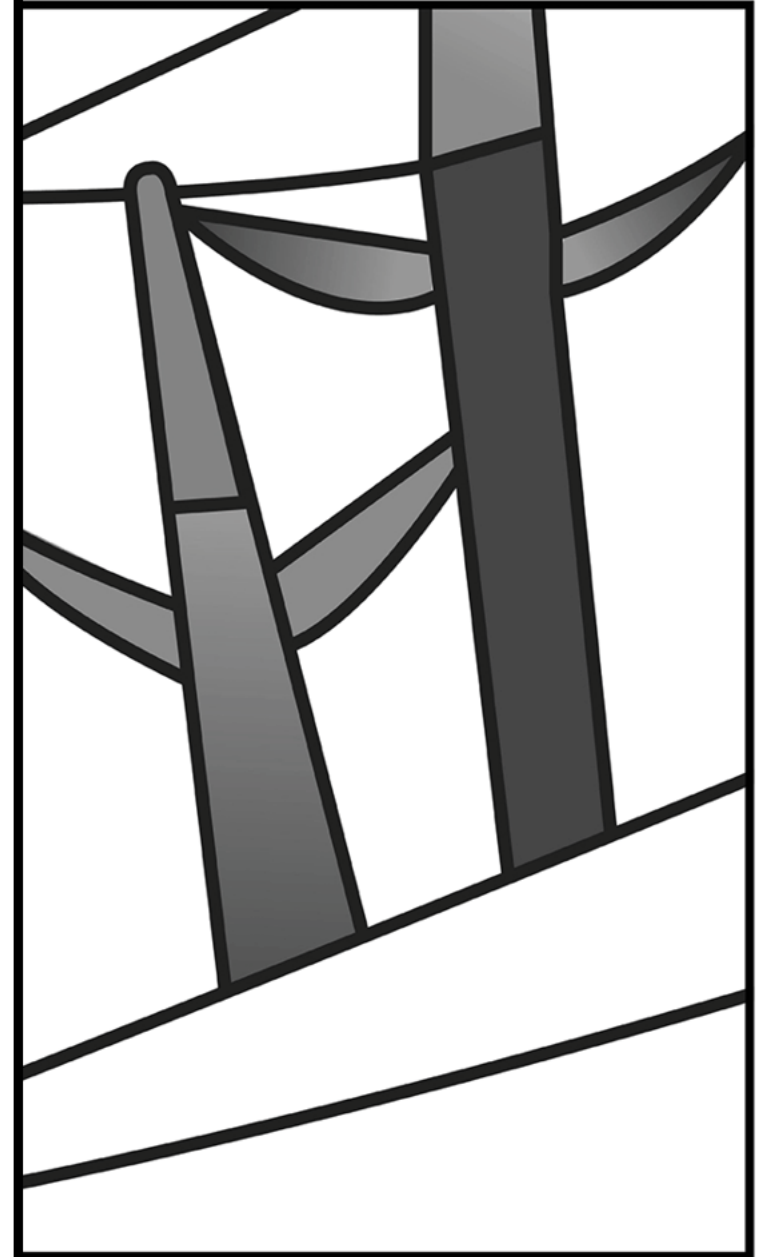
